Letter from CEO


Community Food Bank had its most significant year of feeding families and feeding hope with the challenges we faced with the COVID-19 pandemic. We worked hard to follow the safety protocols outlined by health officials while also serving an average of 600 families a day, Monday through Thursday, in our regular food pantry line. Our family, volunteers, and clients were kept safe by our partners, Danone Foundation, FEMA, Grainger Foundation, North Texas Community Foundation, Rainwater Foundation, Walmart, and World Vision by providing hand sanitizer, face masks, and gloves throughout the year. I am grateful to our new and regular volunteers who filled the void as our corporate partners had to postpone volunteering during most of 2020. I especially appreciate Shift Smart's volunteers funded by conscientious foundations.

The highlight of our year was our Thanksgiving Food Box Giveaway. We provided 5,670 food boxes complete with a turkey and all the traditional trimmings. We also distributed an additional 72,000 USDA's Farmers to Families food boxes.

We are grateful to our primary partners who make our service possible: Walmart, Trader Joe's, Operation Blessing, Feed the Children, FEMA, World Vision, and the following foundations: Amon G. Carter, The Meadows Foundation, The Morris Foundation, Rainwater Foundation, and Sid W. Richardson Foundation.

Community Food Bank successfully serves our North Texas Community thanks to the governance and support of our Board of Directors and Advisory Board Members. We appreciate everyone's continued support. We look forward to serving in the brighter days ahead.





We are one of the leading hunger service agencies in North Texas. We serve the community in a double role. As a food pantry, we provide free food boxes directly to those in need; as a food bank, we freely give our surplus to other smaller nonprofit food pantries. Community Food Bank is the only nonprofit agency in North Texas to fill both roles with no zip code restrictions. Our services are offered to families with children, single head of households, seniors, veterans, the homeless, the working poor, and other nonprofits serving all of the above. We directly distribute food to 600 families per day on average without zip code restrictions and completely free of charge. We emphasize good nutrition by providing fruits, vegetables, frozen meat, poultry, fish, dairy, and fresh produce.

We received over 11.4 million pounds of donated food last year, which equals over 7.6 million meals. Our primary donors are Walmart, Trader Joe's, and U.S. Foods. Our spacious warehouse has four Bay doors and one bobtail door that make it convenient for our donors to unload food and other in-kind donations.

We distribute food to 32 human-service agencies per year, including Belknap Ministries, Christian Care Ministries, Diamonds Wishes, Our House, The Salvation Army, Union Gospel Mission, various senior citizen centers, community pantries, church pantries, and church agencies.

Operations

We serve an average of 600 families per day, Monday through Thursday (9 AM to 1 PM). We offer fresh and frozen meats, produce, dairy, and non-perishables.

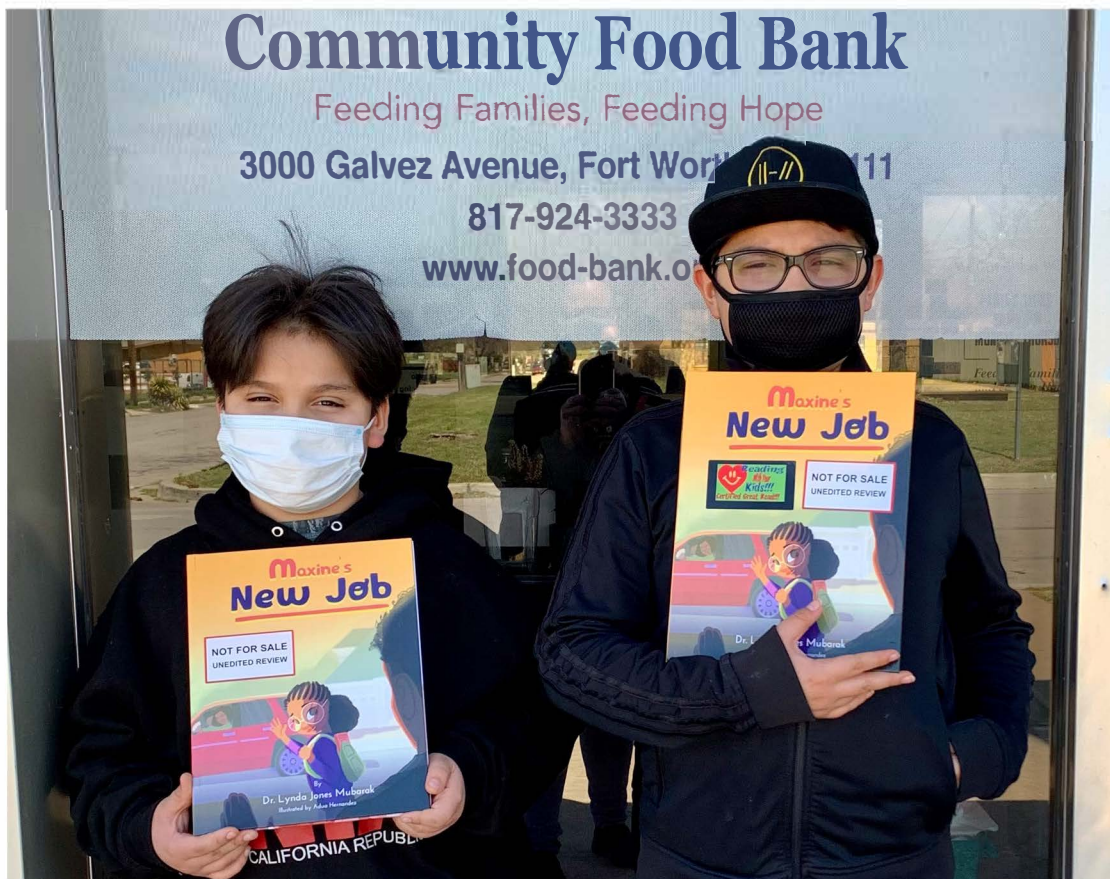


Regena Taylor, Community Food Bank CEO, points to the latest book by Dr. Lynda Mubarak.
